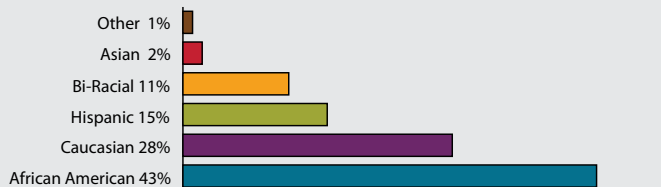

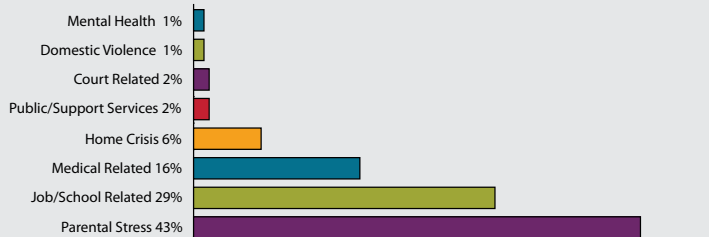

### CRISIS NURSERY'S PROGRAM OUTCOMES

*Outcomes are measured by staff who conduct the surveys with the clients before and after services are provided. Out of 310 families surveyed in fiscal year 2015:*

- 75% reported a decreased level in their stress
- 95% reported a reduced risk of maltreatment
- 96% reported an improvement in parenting skills

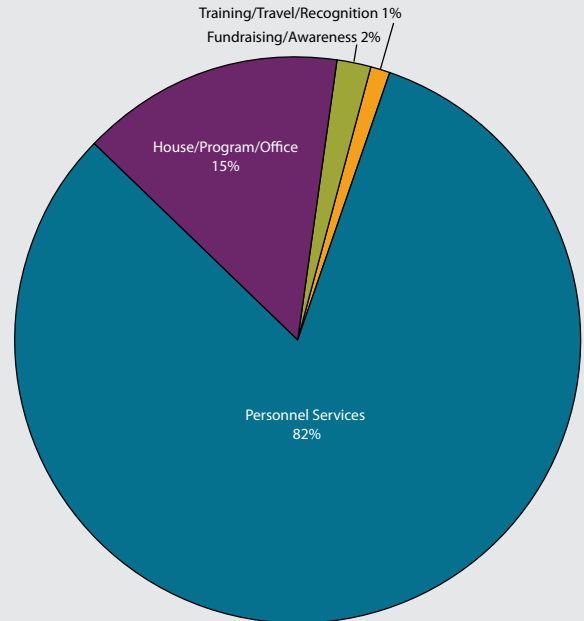
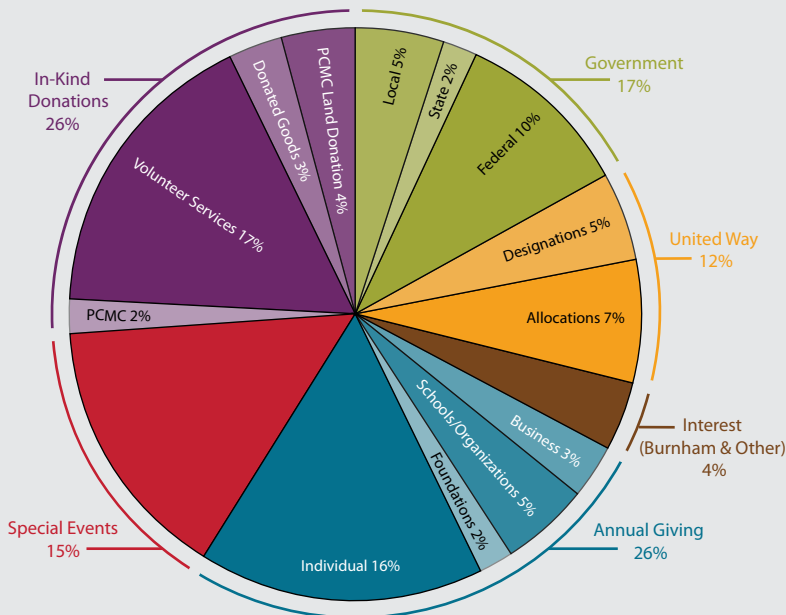
# CRISIS NURSERY FINANCIAL SUMMARY

## Annual Report - Fiscal Year 2015

Our 2015 annual report reflects the value of in-kind donations as well as monetary support.\* This shows our growth, progress, and also the overall picture of what it takes to run the Nursery. \*Income and expenses are for annual fund only and do not include ongoing capital campaign.

### PRESENCE COVENANT MEDICAL CENTER'S IN-KIND DONATION

For the past 16 years, Presence Covenant Medical Center's generous in-kind donations have greatly impacted the daily operations of Crisis Nursery. These donations consist of land rental fees, maintenance, snow removal, lawn care, utility expenses, laundry, meals, meal preparation/delivery, etc. In FY15, these services were valued at approximately \$34,150. Additionally, PCMC donated 8 parcels of land to Crisis Nursery towards the end of FY15 valued at \$150,001 for the Nursery's expansion.

### CRISIS NURSERY FY15 HIGHLIGHTS

- Crisis Nursery served a record number of children in FY15. 886 children were served by our Safe Children and Strong Families programs.
- The Strong Families program continued to expand, providing more education classes, support groups, and Parent-Child Interaction groups than ever before.
- Crisis Nursery announced a \$1.9 million capital campaign to build a 5,800 square foot expansion in response to the growing demand for services. When completed in 2016, the Nursery will be able to serve up to 18 children at once (a 50% increase), reducing turnaways by 90%, and provide more programming in the form of additional support groups, education classes, and Parent-Child Interaction groups.
- Presence Covenant Medical Center gifted 8 parcels of land to Crisis Nursery, achieving one of the Nursery's strategic plan goals of acquiring ownership of the land Crisis Nursery's facility is built upon and enabling the Nursery to expand.
- In anticipation of the expansion, Crisis Nursery hired a full-time Safe Children Program Director with a background in early childhood education and a full-time Strong Families Program Director with a background in social work.
- Each member of the Crisis Nursery Board of Directors made a financial gift to the organization in the first quarter of FY15 to achieve 100% board participation, as well as each raising \$1800 to support a Day at the Nursery. Additionally, each board member pledged financial support to the Nursery's capital campaign. Board members have pledged over \$200,000 towards the expansion.
